APRIL GENERAL MEETING—Thursday, APRIL 7, 2011 at 7:00

Dr. H. Thomas Foster, II will speak to a joint meeting of the Carroll County Historical Society and the Friends of McIntosh Reserve at the Neva Lomason Library on how the Creek Indians and their ancestors shaped the plant



and animal communities that we see today. Dr. Foster, a native of Georgia, is Professor of Anthropology at the University of West Georgia, and Director of the Antonio J. Waring, Jr. Archeological Laboratory. Using archaeology, history, geology, botany, and satellite imagery, he will show the effects of the Native Americans on Georgia's forests.

Dr. Foster earned a Ph. D. in Anthropology from Penn State University and is married with two daughters. He has written two books (*Archaeology of the Lower Muskogee Creek Indians, 1715-1830* and *The Collected Works of Benjamin Hawkins, 1796-1810* published by the University of Alabama Press) and numerous peer-reviewed papers.

The evening is co-sponsored by The Friends of McIntosh Reserve and the Carroll County Historical Society. The public is welcome.
