Curtis Spivey to Speak on *Waiting for the Train— a History of Rail Travel in Carrollton*

Curtis Spivey, a lifelong resident of Carroll County who attended Central High School, will speak on the history of rail travel through Carrollton and the historic depots— the ones that survived and the ones that didn't. He has researched and lived through a large part of Carrollton's transportation history and loves to share it.

He maintains a website devoted to local folklore sharing Southern Stories the way he heard it.

He and his wife, Donna, live on Longview Street with their cat, Tinker. You can identify their house by the bear atop the large tree trunk in the front yard.

Carrollton has had three baseball teams playing in the minor league Class D Georgia-Alabama league- the Carrollton Frogs in 1928, the Champs in 1929 and 1930, and the Hornets from 1946- 1950. The Hornets won the league championship in 1946 (75-55) and 1947 (75-49). Red Roberts , born in 1918 in Carrollton, later played short-stop for the Washington Senators and is buried in Antioch Baptist Church Cemetery.
