## - Frank Searcy and Pat Stayton to Speak at November 21st Meeting - Carrollton Depot at 6:30

Frank Searcy and Pat Stayton answered the call of the military, and served this country at one of the most difficult times in history. In the early 1940 s there was not an Air Force. There was the Army Air Core. These men took their training in different parts of the country.

To become a pilot there were three schools they had to attend. Each one was for thirteen weeks. The first training came at primary flight school, then came basic flight school and finally advanced flight school where they graduated and received their pilots wings.

Recipe of the Month-Italian Rice Balls

### Italian Rice Balls

2 c. white rice cooked in 4 c. of water

2 eggs

8 oz. ricotta cheese

8 oz. shredded mozzarella cheese

4 oz. diced ham

2 T. Parmesan cheese

salt and pepper to taste

1/2 c. seasoned bread crumbs plus bread crumbs for coating rice balls

To the cooked rice add all of the ingredients except the last two Mixture should be slightly wet. If it won't form into balls, add more bread crumbs. If too dry, add another egg. Form into the size of meat balls. Roll in additional bread crumbs. Gently place into skillet with enough oil to come up 3/4 of the way of the rice ball. Cook until well browned on all sides. Yield about 30 balls.
